
friendly office or even a limitless vacation policy.

Also consider the power of layering light sources to set a mood. Comparable to home interior





The next element, power access, means much more than just a convenient place to plug in. When you stop to consider how much of our everyday lives depend upon our electronic and mobile devices,

the priority to keep them powered and charged becomes clear. These devices keep us reachable by our family or colleagues throughout the day; they provide access to instant information that informs and supports our work, as well as streaming playlists that provide a soundtrack to our day.

Further, power access gives mobility and freedom of choice of where to work around the office. Need to escape a chatty distraction or quickly convene with a small team for an update? Power

Finally, don't discount the potential office accessories have to significantly enhance a workspace's aesthetic, comfort, and functionality.
